The Seawanhaka Cup is an historic international challenge for the purpose of promoting small yacht



racing and developing the Corinthian spirit among competing yachtsmen. It is considered to be the oldest yachting trophy originated in the United States that is still in active competition internationally. The first challenge was sailed in Oyster Bay, New York in 1895. The Seawanhaka Cup is a match racing event open to international teams consisting of regular members of the yacht club they are representing and nationals of the country where the club resides.
